

Symposium “A future to fisheries?”

Directions for travelers:

Note: the symposium site has been moved from the Tiensestraat 41 to the **Parkstraat 51**

Plane : Brussels National Airport is your closest destination. Every 30 min (week) and 60 min (WE) you can jump on a direct train from Brussels National Airport (level -2) to Leuven (14 min - 5 €- taxis are not really an option because of traffic jams and cost). From the station head for the Maria Theresiastraat (at your left – 10h30), continue beyond the traffic lights along the Andreas Vesaliusstraat up to the Parkstraat, turn right and you'll find a brand new red/black building 50 m further on at your right hand side (total walking time: 15 min).

Train: international TGV, THALYS and EUROSTAR travelers aim for Brussels South station, while ACE travelers aim for Liège. Twice an hour the intercity (IC) train Brussels – Liège, Brussels – Hasselt or Liège – Brussels will bring you to Leuven after 30 min of travel. From the station head for the Maria Theresiastraat (at your left – 10h30), continue beyond the traffic lights to the Andreas Vesaliusstraat up to the Parkstraat, turn right and you'll find a brand new red/black building 50 m further on at your right hand side (total walking time: 15 min).

Car: Leuven is located at the intersection of highways E40 (Ostend – Brussels – Liège - Köln) and E314 (Leuven – Maastricht – Aachen). The closest (paying) parkings are Ladeuze at Ladeuzeplein / Blijde Inkomststraat (enter from ring road via Tiensepoort) and H. Hart at Naamsestraat 100 (entering from the Naamsepoort on the ringroad). Ladeuzeparking: walk to the symposium site via the Hooverplein and turn left into the Tiensestraat, then immediately right into the Vlamingenstraat, walk up to the T-junction along the park, turn left into the Parkstraat and you will find a brand new red/black building 50 m further on at your left hand side (total walking time: 8 min). H. Hartparking: retrace your steps in the Naamsestraat, take a right, then take the first street at your left continue the Hendrik Consciencestraat up to the third intersection, turn left in the Van Het Sestichstraat then turn left again and you'll find a brand new red/black building 100 m further at your right hand side (total walking time: 8 min). *Travel by train is highly recommended to avoid traffic jams.*
