1. Why a Handbook?

The present booklet is a **living document** that summarizes key concepts and information to **support Belgian representation** and participation in the Ocean Decade.

The Ocean Decade (OD) goes beyond the capacity of a single nation, aims to unify a diversity of disciplines, nationalities, and generations towards co-design transformative ocean science for sustainable development.









2. What is the Ocean Decade about?




Figure 1. Representation of the Ocean Decade Action Framework based on UNESCO graphics.

The Ocean Decade Action Framework

Four elements are key to the implementation of the Ocean Decade:

- 1. **Ocean Decade actions**: tangible initiatives by a wide range of stakeholders to fulfil the objectives and thus achieve the Challenges.
- 2. **Objectives**: the steps in the process that allow us to evolve from the ocean we have to the ocean we want. Objectives are relevant to all Challenges.
- 3. **Challenges**: the most immediate needs with a centralized position.
- 4. Outcomes: representing 'the ocean we want'.

The 7 Ocean Decade Outcomes

- 1. A clean ocean where sources of pollution are identified and reduced or removed.
- 2. A healthy and resilient ocean where marine ecosystems are understood, protected, restored, and managed.
- 3. A productive ocean supporting sustainable food supply and a sustainable ocean economy.
- 4. A predicted ocean where society understands and can respond to changing ocean conditions.
- 5. A safe ocean where life and livelihoods are protected from ocean-related hazards.
- 6. An accessible ocean with open and equitable access to data, information, technology, and innovation.
- 7. An inspiring and engaging ocean where society understands and values the ocean in relation to human well-being and sustainable development.





4. What is the focus of the Ocean Decade?



The Ocean Decade focuses on overcoming 10 challenges, considered critical to achieve 'The Ocean We Want'. The description of each challenge can be found in the Ocean Decade Implementation Plan (<u>summary</u> and <u>long version</u>).

6. How can I contribute?




Figure 5. Ocean Decade actions: programmes, projects, activities, and contributions.

- Programmes: your initiative can be endorsed as a programme if it is long-term (4 years), multinational and covers a global or at least a regional geographic scope.
- Projects: your initiative can be endorsed as a project if it is regional, national, or subnational in scope. It needs to contribute to a Decade programme (check here the current Ocean Decade programmes)
- Activities: one-off, standalone initiatives that contribute to an Ocean Decade challenge(s).
- Contributions: support the Ocean Decade through funding, in-kind expertise, or knowledge (critical and/or transformative).

Theme 1 | Blue Carbon and Nature-based solutions

- Co-design among academia, private sector, government and citizens, bringing together the 4Helix.
- Better guidelines and tools to implement Nature Inclusive Design (NID) and use of Ecosystem Services.
- Support public awareness for transformative change, convince users of planetary boundaries (e.g., Science café's)

Theme 2 | Citizen science and co-design

- Communicate and provide guidance (support) in application procedure for ocean decade endorsement.
- Improve dissemination about the Ocean Decade to non-scientific groups.
- International network: screening of potential partners and/or collaborations with Latin America or African countries

Theme 3 | Building Ocean Knowledge: value chain and capacities

- Disseminate best practices in building knowledge value chains (e.g., OTGA and Ocean InfoHub). Advocate the use of Ocean InfoHub standards.
- Connect knowledge value chains and communities of practitioners/users (e.g., for software and analysis).
- Develop the knowledge value chain to (automate) answer general research questions.
- Package the services (in value chain) and make more accessible all the services by value chain.

From the Ocean Decade:

Vissibility for your work: take it to international forum

Global engagement: get 1st hand information of latest development and diversity of networks/programmes.

Collaboration: accesss specialised networks, accelerate uptake and exchange

Access to resources: training, information, experts, contributions, resources and funding.

From the National Decade Committee:

Ocean Decade Support: Secretariat support to align your initiatives to Agenda 2030

Liaise with existing Ocean Decade actions: programmes, projects, partners.

Add-ons: to magnify impact of Belgian Ocean Decade actions.





The **NDC-BE secretariat** supports the national Ocean Decade actions and partners in the following ways:

- **Ocean Decade secretariat support:** a full-time employee dedicated to supporting coregroup members from the NDC-BE secretariat.
- Liaise with existing Ocean Decade actions: like programmes, projects, and partners to collaborate and bring in the support of shared infrastructure and technologies. For example: Ocean Info Hub (OIH), Ocean Teacher Global Academy (OTGA), Sea Level Station Monitoring Facility, Marine Regions, WoRMS.
- **Add-ons:** Belgian Ocean Decade actions are among priorities for additional and dedicated support from the NDC-BE Secretariat, to enhance their impact. Core-group members can present their endorsed actions and will be evaluated with the co-chairs and NDC-BE Secretariat according to the order in which they are sent.





10. Where am I in the Ocean Decade?




Figure 8. Ocean Decade Ecosystem. Where entities are grouped by their role on advice, support, and decentralised coordination. In yellow is where NDC members can participate.

Central coordination

- 1. **IOC Secretariat**, coordinates the overall work of the Ocean Decade (not sure if this is correct?)
- 2. **Decade Coordination Unit (DCU)** is the central hub that manages the day-to-day operations and implementation of the Ocean Decade, it is hosted by the IOC secretariat.

Advise by

- 3. **UN entities** will get involved through the secretariats to ensure a well-coordinated interagency approach.
- 4. **Decade Advisory Board**, composed of 15 members from 13 countries, provides strategic technical advice on the implementation process. See members here: https://oceandecade.org/decade-advisory-board/
- 5. **Informal Working Groups**, they provide advice and expertise to IOC/UNESCO on the implementation process.





Support / Add-ons by

- 6. Ocean Decade Alliance, eminent partners which aim to catalyse large-scale resource commitments towards the Decade. See patrons and institutional members here: https://oceandecade.org/ocean-decade-alliance/
- 7. Foundations Dialogue, informal, global network of community, corporate and private Foundations that have chosen to work together to support the vision of the Ocean Decade. Affirming their compromise in the Bouknadel Statement.

Decentralised coordination and support

- 8. Decade Collaborative Centres (DCCs) and Decade Coordination offices (DCOs), provide dedicated long-term support to coordinate Decade Actions at the regional (i.e., around major Ocean basins) or thematic (i.e., around Decade Challenges) level. They support capacity development, communications, tracking of progress, resource mobilization, catalysing new partnerships and initiatives. They work in direct collaboration with DCU, NDCs and DIPs.
- 9. Decade Implementing Partners (DIPs), non-UN regional or international organizations, outside formal governance. They act as decentralized coordinators.
