




The GIFS (Geography of Inshore Fisheries and Sustainability) partnership has the pleasure of inviting you to its final stakeholder event:

By air

<u>From Heathrow</u>, take the Piccadilly Line to Green Park, then change to the Jubilee Line, changing again at Canary Wharf onto the DLR and alighting at Cutty Sark.

<u>From Gatwick</u>, take the Thameslink rail service to London Bridge, change onto the London Underground to take the Jubilee Line to Canary Wharf and take the DLR line to Cutty Sark. <u>From London City Airport</u>, take the shuttle bus to Canning Town then the DLR to Cutty Sark (change at Poplar). The DLR runs to London City Airport, change at Poplar and get onto a Lewisham/Greenwich Bound train - Journey time approx 23 minutes.

By rail

To Greenwich Mainline Station, exit the station and turn left. Walk down the High Road (past the Cafe Rouge on the right) and bear right at the lights onto Nelson Road (NatWest and Mexican Restaurant on the right). Take the first right up King William Walk and the main entrance to Devonport House is 100m on the left.

By tube

The nearest DLR station is Cutty Sark for Maritime Greenwich. Turn left out of the station and proceed down the small arcade. Cross the road and head down College Approach towards the Old Royal Naval College. At the end of College Approach (in front of the West Gates) turn right onto King William Walk. Cross Romney Road (pedestrian crossing on left hand side), carry on up King William Walk towards Greenwich Park/Royal Park. Devonport House is on the left.
